### CAO – General Info.

Centralised application system for Irish 3<sup>rd</sup> level Education Institutions, including feepaying colleges.

### Selection of courses

Apply for up to 20 courses

- Level 8 list Choose 10
  - Honours Degrees

- Level 6/7 list Choose 10
  - Higher Certificates
  - Ordinary Degrees





# National Framework of Qualifications – 10 Levels



### Level 8 – Minimum Entry Requirement

- Different colleges have different entry requirements
- •Most Level 8 courses require 2 H5 and 4 H7/O6
- •NUI colleges (UCD, UCC, UM & NUIG) look for Irish, English, Maths and a **third language** in your six subjects.
- •Some courses in NUI colleges e.g. Science and Engineering courses do not have a **third language** requirement

# Level 8 – Minimum Entry Requirements continued

- TCD requires 3 H5 and 3O6/H7to include English, Maths and another language
- Institutes of Technology require 2H5 and 4O6/H7 to include Maths and English or Irish
- CHECK PROSPECTUS

# STAGE 2: Faculty Requirements

Examples....

- 1. Physiotherapy (TCD) -H4 in 2 science
- **2. Physiotherapy (UL)-**O3/H7 in 1 science subject

**Primary Teaching** Gaeilge-Grade H4

Mathematics – O4 or H7

English – O4 or H7

# College Prospectus should always be consulted

If all Entry Requirements and Faculty requirements (if needed) are met  $\rightarrow$  applicant is deemed 'Qualified' to apply.

THEN

"Points" are considered.

### **POINTS SYSTEM**

- Points are calculated from ONE sitting of the Leaving Certificate only.
- Points total is calculated from SIX best subjects
- •New system of Bonus points are awarded for H6 in Mathematics (Maximum points now 625)
- Entry/Faculty Requirements can be satisfied over more than one sitting of the Leaving Certificate

### Medicine

- Entry/Faculty Requirements can be satisfied over more than one sitting of the Leaving Certificate except Medicine.
- Only one sitting of the Leaving Cert. is considered for Medicine.
- H Pat results are relevant only for the year applying.

#### **RESTRICTED ENTRY COURSES**

- Some courses have Interviews/ Aptitude tests/Portfolio/Auditions
- Must apply to CAO by February 1<sup>st</sup> for these courses
- ■Medicine HPAT test February 24<sup>th</sup>
  - Apply by January 20<sup>th</sup>
- Check CAO handbook



- The Application Process usually begins in May
- Register> Complete Application > Decision will follow
- Applications will be accepted up to 1<sup>st</sup> of August

### **After Making Application**

- Some students may be called for extra assessments.
- Receive Statement of Application Record (Before the end of May) – check details carefully.
- Change of Mind facility becomes available use sparingly and carefully. (May 6<sup>th</sup> - 1<sup>st</sup> July)
- Leaving Cert. Results are sent to CAO. (mid August)

- Reply by 23<sup>rd</sup>. August at 5.15pm
- Round 2
- 28<sup>th</sup>. August from 10am
- Reply by 30<sup>th</sup>. August at 5.15pm

- Reply by 11<sup>th</sup>. September at 5.15pm

### **Places Allocation**

- Students should think carefully about not accepting one of these offers, as they may not receive any further offers.
- Regardless of whether or not they accept a course in round 1, they will still be offered a higher preference course in subsequent rounds if they become entitled to one.

Offer of places (contd.)

By way of example: Let's say you have 350 points and your course preference on the CAO form is:

# Deferral

- Place is held for 1 academic year
- You are recommended to check with the college in advance about their deferral conditions and arrangements- some courses where deferral will be difficult or impossible.
- When offered place, contact admissions office of university IMMEDIATELY – mark deferred entry- must be done at least 2 days before REPLY DATE on offer notice – decision will be made



### **Access Schemes DARE**

- Disability Access Route to Education
- A quota of places offered to students with disability on reduced points basis.
- Must meet minimum requirements.
- See wwwaccesscollege.ie for list of disability eligibility
- Supplementary forms available at cao.ie

### **ACCESS SCHEMES: HEAR**

- •HEAR Higher Education Access Route For students from socio-economically disadvantaged backgrounds.
- •Quota of places offered on a reduced points basis.
- Must meet minimum entry requirements
- Must satisfy 3 of the 6 indicators
- •See <u>www.accesscollege.ie</u> for further information



### DARE and HEAR Schemes

- Must apply to CAO by February 1<sup>st</sup>
- By March 1<sup>st –</sup> disclose your disability and complete all elements of the online form (SIF- Supplementary Information Form)
- Final date for submission of supporting documentation to arrive in CAO by 1<sup>st</sup> April
- CHECK CAO BOOKLET PAGE 9 AND 10

5 <sup>th</sup> . November (12:00)	CAO online application facility opens. CAO Change of Course choices facility opens	
20th January (17:15)	Apply online by this date to avail of the discounted application fee of €30.	
1st February (17:15)	Normal closing date for applications.	
5th February (12:00)	Online facility to amend course choices becomes available (€10 Fee)	
23th February	HPAT Test - Undergraduate Entry to Medicine	
1st March (17:15)	Closing date for amending course choices Closing date for final completion of online HEAR/DARE forms

### **Non CAO Options: Apprenticeships**

- Find a suitable employer
- Employer registers the apprentice with SOLAS within two weeks of starting
- SOLAS are the agency working with the Dept. of Education and Skills on apprenticeships
- Meet the minimum educational requirements i.e.
   5 Passes in Junior Cert- some employers look for more.
- Paid by the employer
- Receive a level 6- FETAC Higher Certificate which may be used to link the apprentice to Degree Programmes in Institutes of Technology.

## Apprenticeships

 Experience has shown that higher grades of entry than those suggested by SOLAS are preferred for certain apprenticeships, (e.g. electrician) due to the technical nature of the trade. Employers typically seek applicants who have completed Leaving Cert including Maths (with at least a grade C3 in Ordinary Level Maths) and preferably Physics.

# **Apprenticeships**

 New Apprenticeships coming on stream such as with the Insurance Federation of Ireland.

Students register interest on Apprenticeship.ie

### **More Non CAO Options**

- Gardaí and Defence Forces check www.publicjobs.ie
- Direct into employment
- UCAS applications (for England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland)
- Post Leaving Certificate Courses with Fetac links schemes

### Post Leaving Certificate courses (PLCs)

- Courses in very high demand
- Last one to two years.
- Apply early to be called for interview in March
- Contact each college/check college websites to see when they will start accepting your application.
- Most PLC courses expect to fill all places in March interviews
- Requirements usually 5 passes in your Leaving Certificate. Please consult prospectus for 2019 entry requirements.
- Importance of Interview and some <u>experience</u> of the career area applying for.

#### **Post Leaving Certificate Courses:**

FETAC Links Scheme run by PLC Colleges and some Higher Education Institutes- these provide a possible pathway to higher education

- Please note it's a possible pathway, not an automatic link- you must excel in your course
- Especially Important for Students who may not make the CAO Points
- Check course code in PLC and see if it is listed under relevant qualifications for any degree course you may wish to apply for- check modules required
- Can begin with a PLC and end up with a Doctorate
- Mature Entry to College (age 23 or over)
