CAO – General Info.

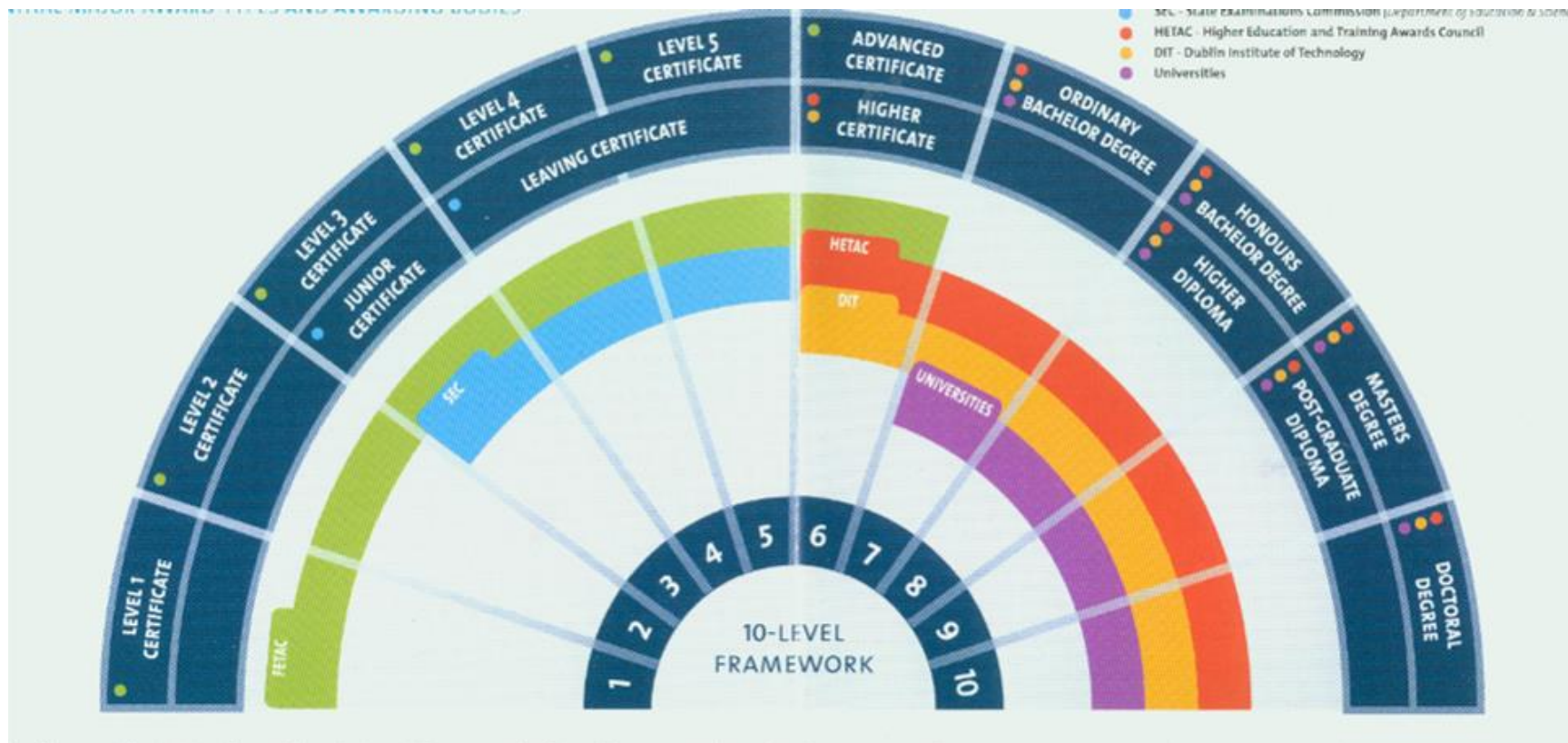
Centralised application system for 47 Irish 3rd level institutions, including 7 fee-paying colleges.

Selection of courses

- **Apply for up to 20 courses**
- **Level 8 list – Choose 10**
 - Honours Degrees
- **Level 6/7 list – Choose 10**
 - Higher Certificates
 - Ordinary Degrees



National Framework of Qualifications – 10 Levels



Matriculation Requirements

- **Different colleges have different entry requirements**
- Most Level 8 courses require 2 H5 and 4 H7/O6
- NUI colleges (UCD, UCC, UM & NUIG) look for Irish, English, Maths and a **third language** in your six subjects.
- Some courses in NUI colleges e.g. Science and Engineering courses do not have a **third language** requirement

Level 8 – Minimum Entry Requirements
continued

- **TCD** requires 3 H5 and 3O6/H7 to include English, Maths and another language
- **Institutes of Technology** require 2H5 and 4O6/H7 to include Maths and English **or** Irish
- ***CHECK PROSPECTUS***

STAGE 2:

Faculty Requirements

Examples....

- 1. Physiotherapy (TCD) –H4 in 2 science subjects one of which can be Maths**
- 2. Physiotherapy (UL)-O3/H7 in 1 science subject.(not Maths)**
- 3. Primary Teaching – H4 in Irish**

College Prospectus should always be consulted

If all Entry Requirements and Faculty requirements (if needed) are met → applicant is deemed 'Qualified' to apply.

POINTS SYSTEM

- **Points** are calculated from **ONE** sitting of the Leaving Certificate only.
- Points total is calculated from **SIX** best subjects
- New system of Bonus points are awarded for H6 in Honours Mathematics (Maximum points now 625)
- **Entry/Faculty Requirements** can be satisfied over more than one sitting of the Leaving Certificate except in Medicine.

Bonus Points for Irish

- Students taking subjects through Irish can receive bonus points.
- The points are awarded as a % of the mark received. 10% for some subjects and 5 % for others including Maths if they get under 75%
- If they get above 75% it is on a sliding scale.
- Written components of the subject must be answered wholly in Irish.
- Candidate who answer partly in Irish and partly in English receive no bonus marks.
- Check out State Examinations Commission

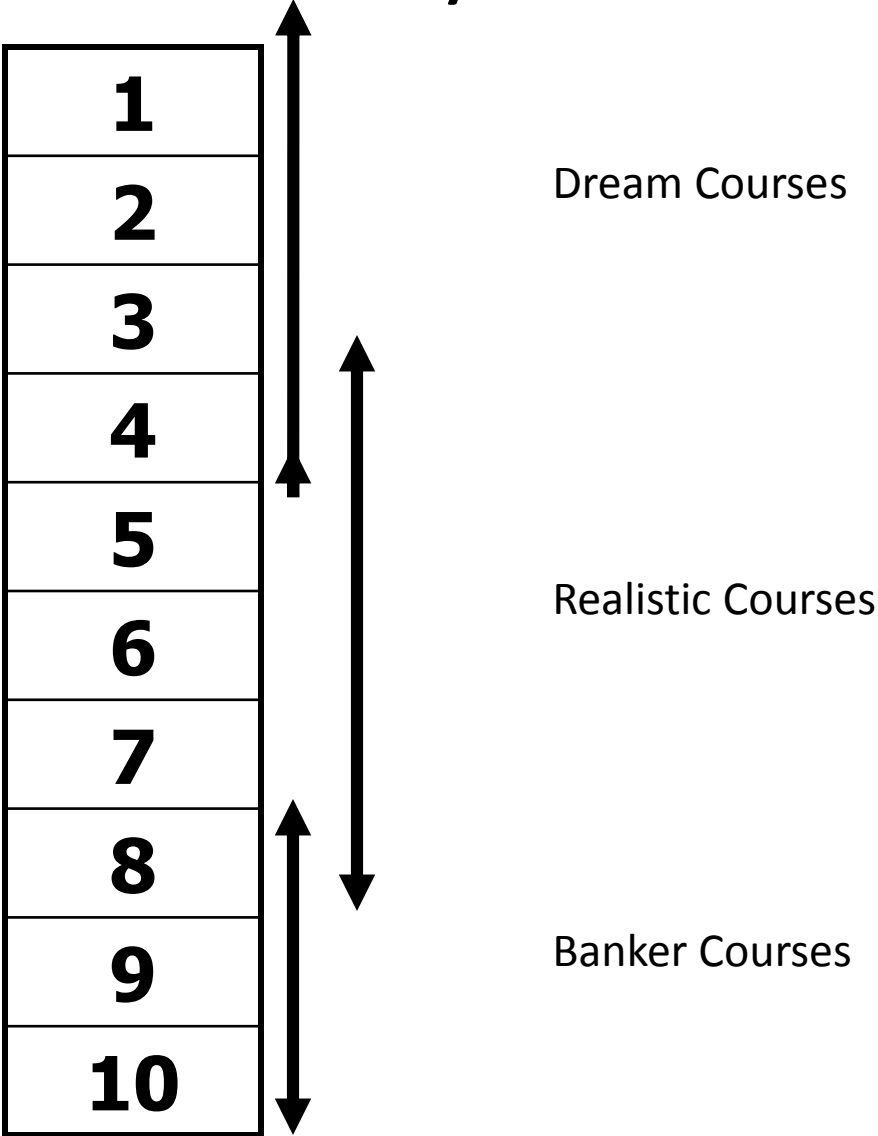

RESTRICTED ENTRY COURSES

- Some courses have **Interviews/ Aptitude tests/Portfolio/Auditions**
- **Must apply to CAO by February 1st for these courses**
- **Medicine – HPAT test February 22nd
– apply by January 20th**

- Applications can be made online.
- Online-print screen receipt.
- Fill out both course lists

After Making Application

- ⦿ Receive CAO number and Statement of Course Choices – **check this carefully.**
- ⦿ Some students may be called for extra assessments.
- ⦿ Receive Statement of Application Record (Before the end of May)– **check details carefully.**
- ⦿ Change of Mind facility becomes available – use sparingly and carefully. (May 5th - 1st July)
- ⦿ Leaving Cert. Results are sent out Tuesday August 11th.
- ⦿ Application to view scripts on line on SEC Student Portal Aug.12-14th.

- ◎ Thursday August 13th. CAO release round 1 offers
- ◎ Tuesday August 18th - Wednesday 19th students can view scripts in school.
- ◎ Scripts corrected on line can be viewed also on line from 5pm Tuesday 18th and Wednesday 19th.
- ◎ Friday August 14th to 20th. Students who wish to appeal can do so on line on Students Portal. Fee of €40 per subject applies which is refunded if student gets an upgrade.
- ◎ Friday August 21st. Closing date for receipt of acceptance of offers.
- ◎ Wednesday August 26th. Round 2 Offers.
- ◎ Friday 28th August closing date for acceptance of round 2 offers.
- ◎ Friday 18th September Results of LC appeals. Final offers of places by CAO will be made in days following this.

Offer of Places



- 2 offers may be received: 1 from Level 8 list and 1 from Level 6/7 list.

ONLY ONE OFFER MAY BE ACCEPTED

- When you are offered one of your course preferences on a list, automatically you will be excluded for consideration from all courses below that

YOU MAY NOT MOVE DOWN IN YOUR ORDER OF PREFERENCES

- This is why it is so important to fill in form in your Genuine Order of Preference

Places Allocation

- ◎ Students should think carefully about not accepting one of these offers, as they may not receive any further offers.
- ◎ Regardless of whether or not they accept a course in round 1, they will still be offered a higher preference course in subsequent rounds *if* they become entitled to one.

Offer of places (contd.)

By way of example: Let's say you have 350 points and your course preference on the CAO form is:

1. Physics 2. Business 3. Arts 4. Tourism

Order of Preference	Course	1 st Round Offer Points	2 nd Round Offer Points	3 rd Round Offer Points

Deferral

- **Place is held for 1 academic year**
- **You are recommended to check with the college in advance about their deferral conditions and arrangements- some courses where deferral will be difficult or impossible.**
- **When offered place, contact admissions office of university IMMEDIATELY – mark deferred entry- must be done at least 2 days before REPLY DATE on offer notice – decision will be made**

- **The Application Process usually begins in May**
- **Register > Complete Application > Decision will follow**
- **Applications will be accepted up to 1st of August**

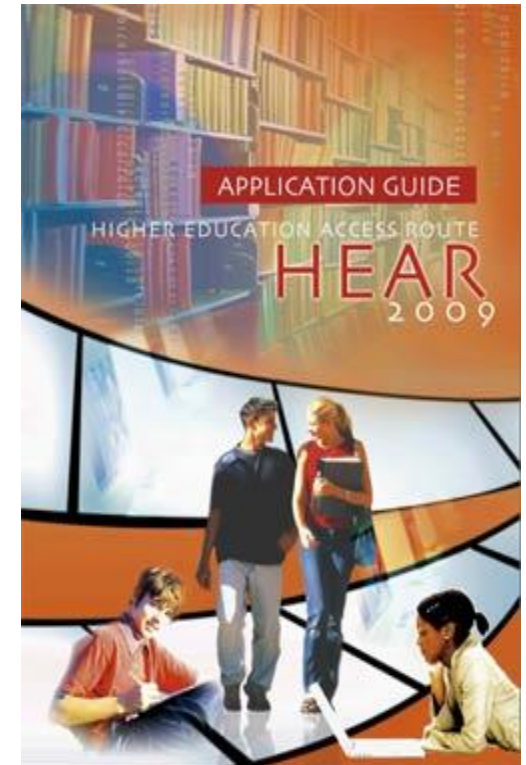


Disability Access Route To Education

- DARE – Disability Access Route to Education
- 19 DARE and 15 HEAR Colleges participating
- A quota of places offered to students with disability on a reduced points basis.
- Must meet minimum entry requirements
- See: www.accesscollege.ie for list of disabilities eligible
- Supplementary forms available at cao.ie

ACCESS SCHEMES: HEAR

- HEAR – Higher Education Access Route
For students from socio-economically disadvantaged backgrounds.
- Quota of places offered on a reduced points basis.
- Must meet minimum entry requirements
- Must satisfy 3 of the 6 indicators
- See www.accesscollege.ie for further information



DARE and HEAR Schemes

- Must apply to CAO by **February 1st**
- **By March 1st – disclose your disability and complete all elements of the online form (SIF- Supplementary Information Form)**
- Final date for submission of **supporting documentation** to arrive in **CAO** by **1st April**

CAO Timetable

- ◎ **5th November, 2019**
 - > CAO Online facility opens at 12.00 noon
- **20th January, 2020**
 - > Early Bird offer ends
- ◎ **1st February, 2020**
 - > Closing date for receipt of normal applications
- ◎ **1st May, 2020**
 - > Closing date for receipt of late applications
- ◎ **Before/By 31st May, 2020**
 - > Receive Statement of Application Record
- ◎ **From 5th May, 2020**
 - > Change of mind facility opens.
- ◎ **1st July, 2020**
 - > Latest date for receipt of change of mind in CAO.
- ◎ **August 11th., 2020 -**
 - > First round of offers will commence.

Non CAO Options: Apprenticeships

- Find a suitable employer
- Employer registers the apprentice with SOLAS within two weeks of starting
- SOLAS are the agency working with the Dept. of Education and Skills on apprenticeships
- Meet the minimum educational requirements i.e. 5 Passes in Junior Cert- some employers look for more.
- Paid by the employer
- Receive a level 6- Fetaac Higher Certificate which may be used to link the apprentice to Degree Programmes in Institutes of Technology.

Other Non CAO Options

- **Direct into Employment**
- **Gardaí and Defence Forces** – check www.publicjobs.ie
- **Post Leaving Certificate Courses** with Fetaac links schemes
- **UCAS** applications (for England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland)
- **EUNiCAS**: An independent European University application support service that facilitates UK and Irish students who are looking to study in Europe.

Post Leaving Certificate Courses: Further Education Training Awards

- FETAC Links Scheme run by PLC Colleges and some Higher Education Institutes- these provide a possible pathway to higher education
- **Please note** – it's a **possible** pathway, **not an automatic link-** you must excel in your course
- Especially Important for Students who may not make the CAO Points
- Check course code in PLC and see if it is listed under relevant qualifications for any degree course your son may wish to apply for- check modules required.
- Can begin with a PLC and end up with a Doctorate
- Mature Entry to College (age 23 or over)

Post Leaving Certificate courses (PLCs)

- Courses in very high demand
- Last - one to two years.
- **Apply early** to be called for interview in March
- **Contact each college/check college websites** to see when they will start accepting your application.
- Most PLC courses expect to fill all places in March interviews
- Requirements – usually 5 passes in your Leaving Certificate. Please consult prospectus for 2016 entry requirements.
- Importance of Interview and some **experience** of the career area applying for.
